Minister's Letter

I am not sure that the nature of the office of churchwarden is fully understood in this parish. It is a very ancient office, and has a civic aspect to it, as well as being a role within the church. This is reflected by the people who are entitled to attend and vote at the meeting at which church wardens are appointed every year. It isn't just the people who have indicated an interest in church matters and taken the necessary steps to get onto the church electoral roll. Anyone who is on the local government register of electors and is resident in the parish is entitled not only to turn up at the meeting and vote for their preferred candidate, but also to nominate people for appointment. People on the civil register of electors are also entitled to challenge the result of the election of a church warden, if they believe there was an irregularity in the procedure at the meeting.

There are further criteria to be met before a person can be nominated to the office. They must be over 21 years of age, baptised communicants, on the ecclesiastical electoral role of the parish concerned and not disqualified, again under civil law, from being a charity trustee. And also they must consent to be nominated!

However, my point is that filling the office of church warden should be of interest not just to those who are regular church attenders, but to everyone in the parish. Sadly, this interest was not reflected in the attendance at our annual meeting in April. Only a minority of the people on the church electoral roll actually attended, and no one who was solely qualified to attend by virtue of being on the local government register of electors in our parish was there.

As I said in an earlier article for this magazine, we are greatly in need of some younger people to join the present church wardens, and in due course take over from them. It is particularly important now, as the parish begins its search for someone to take my place when I retire later this year. One of the things which will dissuade potential applicants is the suspicion that they may end up in a parish without functioning church wardens.

You may not be qualified under the above criteria to volunteer for this post yourself, but if you are on the local government register of electors you are entitled to be part of the arm twisting which seems to be necessary to get people to take on civic responsibilities these days. It should be much easier to persuade two or three people to accept a nomination, since they will know there will be other people to help them, and they won't bear the responsibility alone.

So, over to you! Get your thinking caps on: who needs to be persuaded to take on this role?

From the Registers:

In preparation for my move later this year, I am beginning to sort through all kinds of paperwork accumulated not just in the 10 years that I have been living in Cumbria, but in more than 40 years of ordained ministry. I recently came across a piece of paper, probably compiled soon after I arrived in the parish, on which I had noted statistics from the 2011 census. The data from the 2021 census has been available for a while now, so I thought it would be interesting to see how the parish has changed between the two census years.

There is a caveat: the census districts from which the data is derived do not map exactly onto parish council boundaries, and I think the source of my information about the 2021 census was one step removed from the government agency which publishes the figures.

One surprise was that the population of Lamplugh civil parish dropped significantly over that period, from 805 in 2011 to 745 in 2021. (I imagine the population will have increased since 2021 as more of the houses in the Millfields development have been occupied.) Ennerdale and Kinniside civil parish showed a slight increase from 220 to 226.

Perhaps less surprising was the fact that the people who live here have been getting older. In 2011 across both parishes 187 people were aged 65 and over. By 2021 this had increased to 267. Also in line with current trends was a decline in religiosity. In 2011 274 people either stated they had no religion or failed to answer that question (which if I remember correctly is an optional question); by 2021 that number had increased to 362. In 2011 everyone who claimed a religious affiliation was a Christian, but by 2021 there were 12 people who claimed that they followed a religion other than Christianity, alongside the 554 who claimed to be Christian.

But while statistics are interesting, our call is to care for people, who are always more than the sum of information gathered about them in censuses and other surveys. So there is no substitute for getting to know our neighbours, in all their glorious individuality.

Beavers at Ennerdale

Since 2019, Forestry England have aspired to release beavers into Ennerdale Valley in Cumbria. Early plans for a partial beaver enclosure were paused in October 2023 because there were concerns about the proposed metal grill across the lower River Liza and its potential to deter salmon and trout from passing to their spawning grounds upstream. Therefore, a beaver release directly into the wild was not an available option at that time.

On 28th February 2025, the Government announced a two-step licensing process to allow beavers to be released into the wild. The first step is an "expression of interest" that requires a high-level statement against each of the nine wild release criteria. This process avoids applicants, Natural England and other stakeholders investing time on full applications that are unlikely to secure a licence in the first round of applications. Only those projects deemed most viable will be invited to make a full application. This will help manage beaver reintroductions at a measured pace.

Forestry England has submitted an "expression of interest" for a wild beaver release into Ennerdale, with support from other Wild Ennerdale partnership organisations (National Trust, United Utilities and Natural England), and expect to receive a response by early July 2025. If successful, Forestry England will engage with those likely to be affected by the proposals from this point.

Share your thoughts

Each catchment and each property will experience beavers differently. Please help Forestry England develop a comprehensive, site-specific management plan that is practical and relevant to the River Ehen catchment.

- Do you own, live on, work on, or spend your free time on land in the River Ehen catchment with a river, stream or ditch that might be affected by beavers?
- Are there areas on your property where you would welcome co-existence with beavers?
- Do you have infrastructure, vegetation, land use or activities that could be impacted by beavers?

If Forestry England are invited to apply for a licence, the points you raise will inform the next steps in the engagement. For further information, please contact:


